Hello, again. I hope everyone had a good holiday season. It is good to be back in commission once again. I would like to thank the following people for their efforts while I was away. Greg Dunn, who had served as Shuttle Commander in my place; Craig Dennis, who served as his first officer; Matt Morris, who served (and still serves) as a liaison officer between us and our mother ship, U.S.S. *Columbus*, the Commander, officers and crew of the *Columbus* for their support; and most important of all, Clarence Bradley, without whom this organization would probably still be hunting for a place to meet. My personal thanks and gratitude to these people.

Over the last month or so, Greg and I have been working on an award program for the shuttle. So far, there are 65 possible awards that one can earn. These ribbons are similar to those worn on Star Trek VI, and are to be worn on Type 1 black ActionWear shirt 1/8 inch above the left pocket, and 1 inch below the CommBadge; *Star Trek: The Next Generation* ceremonial dress uniform 1 inch under the Comm Badge; *Star Trek II-VI* movie uniforms 1 inch below the breast insignia. These ribbons are to be worn in rows of three, with the most important ribbon uppermost and closest to the heart. If you

have an incomplete row of 1 or two ribbons, the incomplete row should be the lower-most and centered. (See diagram below)



There are currently 65 awards available to the membership at this time, and the number will grow as time passes. For details, see the article on Awards.

On a more serious note: Concerning Senior Officers' Reports. One of the duties of a senior officer of this organization is to fill out a monthly report to the first officer. A standardized form will be issued to each officer for this purpose. Though you, as a division officer, may be the only one in your division, and may have nothing to report concerning your progress in getting a division of people together, you may report ideas you might have for the

organization as a whole, or even ideas you have for your division in the future. If you have any concerns, this is a good place for you to express them. If you have nothing at all to report, take this form, check the Nothing to Report box indicated on the form, and get it to myself or to BRAD'S BOOKSTORE one week from the meeting date.

An article in the newsletter for division heads would be nice as well, however this is not necessarily required at this time. Remember, reports are worth promotion points toward rank. When we begin operations as a shuttle with STARFLEET, Rob, as shuttle commander, will have to write four reports to our superiors, and your information will help him considerably in writing these reports.

If this were an independent organization, these reports will also help us when it comes to making policy, so they are very important. It is a means for the C.O. and I to determine the state of morale of the membership, any problems, concerns, and progress. It will also help us know who is up for promotion, recognition for achievement, and it will let us know whether a policy is working or not. YOUR input is very important to the efficient running of an organization like this. If you have any questions on how to make out a report, contact me or Commander Lyon, and we will help you in any way possible. At the February meeting, I will have twelve forms for each division officer and an instruction manual for filling

promotions/demotions for all ranks below captain, and merit awards for active duty members.

(E) The LTC makes ALL final decisions and policies that do not conflict with STARFLEET and/or its constitution, unless overruled by two thirds [2/3] vote of the executive staff.

(F) The LTC collects a regular status report from all of the Launch Team Divisional Officers.

(G) The LTC shall hold the responsibility for sending a monthly status report to Commander, U.S.S. Columbus (NCC-1006), or his Liaison Officer. Reports should include membership statistics, needs, problems, activities, et. al.

(H) Should the LTC be unable to continue in his duties as Chairperson, or is relieved of his duty by the Regional Coordinator or STARFLEET Command, then a new chairperson will be elected by 2/3 majority of the full chapter membership.

(I) Chain of Command following the LTC is as follows:

- (1) Launch Team Executive Officer [LTX].
- (2) Chief Operations Officer [CHOPS].
- (3) Chief Security Officer [CSO].
- (4) Chief Engineering Officer [CEO].
- (5) Science Officer [SO].
- (6) Chief Medical Officer [CMO].
- (7) Chief of Special Services [CSS].
- (8) Cadet Corps Commandant [CdCOM].

(J) In case the LTC is absent or unable to perform his duties, the LTX, CHOPS, CSO, CEO, SO, CMO, CSS, CdCOM in this order shall assume the duties of the Commanding Officer until he is able to assume his duties or a replacement is elected.

(F) The LTC performs such other and further duties as shall from time to time be required of him by others.

§ 9304.03 Petitioning Organization Vice Chairman [LTX].

(A) The Petitioning Organization Vice Chairman (henceforth called Launch Team Exec, or LTX), assumes and discharges the duties of the LTC in the absence of the LTC. (See §9304.01)

(B) The LTX shall be responsible for all personnel matters, including assisting members (especially the LTC) in any way possible.

(C) The LTX coordinates with and supervises the division heads.

(D) The LTX chairs Promotion Boards and the Board of Inquiry.

(E) The LTX is responsible for receiving and passing on monthly division head reports to the LTC, and prepares a report summarizing the reports given by the division heads to the LTC.

§ 9304.04 Launch Team Division Officers.

(A) Launch Team Division Officers are the following officers:

(1) COMMAND STAFF DIVISION.

(a) The Command Staff Division is under the responsibility of the Launch Team Executive Officer.

(2) OPERATIONS DIVISION.

(a) The Operations Division is under the responsibility of the Chief Operations Officer.

(a) He will assume and discharge the duties of the Launch Team Commander in the absence of the Launch Team Commander and the Launch Team Executive Officer. (See §9304.02)

(8) A launch team Division Officer is

responsible to the Launch Team Commander and the Launch Team Executive Officer for the officer and enlisted members within his division.

(C) A Launch team Division Officer is responsible for keeping track of promotion requirements and points for those within his division.

(D) A launch team Division Officer contacts members within his division concerning dates, locations, times and any changes in plans concerning meetings, parties, events, etc.

(E) A launch team Division Officer is responsible for recruiting and division activities that are independent from launch team activities.

(F) A launch team Division Officer is responsible for submitting a report once a month to the Launch Team Executive Officer concerning the status of his division.

(G) A launch team Division Officer performs duties as may be required from time to time by membership within his division.

(H) A launch team Division Officer holds conferences with each member in his division concerning advancement in rank, morale, problems, suggestions, etc.

§ 9304.05 Launch Team Staff Officers.

(A) Launch team Staff Officers are officers who do not stand in line to command the Launch Team should the Launch Team Commander, and Launch Team Executive Officer be absent and unable to perform their duties, however perform specific duties important to the functioning of the launch team.

(B) Staff Officers include the following officers:

- (1) Launch Team Civil Affairs Officer.
- (2) Launch Team Records Officer.
- (3) Launch Team Training Officer.
- (4) Launch Team Parser.

§ 9304.06 Launch Team Civil Affairs Officer.

(A) The Launch Team Civil Affairs Officer shall hold the responsibility of scheduling and running of all charity and fund-raising events. All events shall be scheduled as far in advance as practical. Such

scheduling shall be made during the Launch Team Executive Staff Meeting.

(B) The Launch Team Civil Affairs Officer shall be responsible for all matters concerning building and maintaining membership.

(C) The Launch Team Civil Affairs Officer oversees recruiting officers and/or petty officers assigned within the individual divisions.

§ 9304.07 Launch Team Secretary.

(A) The Launch Team Secretary (henceforth Launch Team "Records Officer") shall keep minutes of the proceedings of the meetings of the Launch Team and make proper record of the same, which shall be attested to by him.

(B) The Records Officer shall report the activities of these functions at the regular scheduled monthly meeting. This report, or "reading of the minutes" shall be approved by voice vote of the chapter members.

(C) The Records Officer shall handle all correspondence of the Launch Team and shall perform such duties as may be required of him by the membership.

§ 9304.08 Launch Team Training Officer.

(A) The Launch Team Training Officer introduces Launch Team by-laws, regulations, and procedure to new members.

(B) The Launch Team Training Officer interviews new members concerning interests outside of STARFLEET, expectations of the Launch Team, special abilities that would benefit the petitioning organization, and so on. Once information is obtained, it is provided to the command staff and to the division officer when the new member chooses a division for his assignment.

(C) The Training Officer introduces new members to the Launch Team Commander, and arranges a time for one-on-one discussion between the Launch Team Commander and the new member.

(D) The Launch Team Training Officer provides information concerning rank, schools, positions and divisions, and what each has to offer.

(E) The Launch Team Training Officer

introduces new members to the general membership.

(F) The Launch Team Training Officer provides membership packets to new members.

(G) The Launch Team Training Officer introduces new members to the division head of the division to which the new member has chosen for his assignment, and arranges a time for one-on-one discussion between the division head and the new member.

(H) The Launch Team Training Officer assists new and older members alike in matters concerning STARFLEET correspondence courses.

CHAPTER 9305: BANKS AND PROMOTIONS

§ 9305.01 Banks and Positions in General.

- (A) In all STARFLEET Chapters, all members in good standing of STARFLEET, The International Star Trek Fan Association, are assigned fictional rank and position within the structure of their chapter.
- (B) The promotion system of the Maximillian was created to recognize service to the chapter and to STARFLEET. It has been designed to simulate the paramilitary aspects of STARFLEET as seen in Star Trek and to recognize contributions and achievements by our members in a fair and equitable manner, and to tie into the larger, international organization to which we are all a part.
- (C) Even though many members of STARFLEET are adults, we still have the hearts of children and still like to play and pretend. Members who so desire may hold a fictional 'rank' in our organization upon granting of Shuttle status, and can earn promotions through doing good works and becoming involved in STARFLEET and chapter activities.
- (D) It is very important to remember that ranks really only reflect the length of service in the organization and a member's level of involvement.
- (E) STARFLEET has found through experience that members do in fact care a great deal about their ranks and the Maximillian does not want to diminish that intensity by

cheapening the promotion process. Thus, the following promotion requirements have been designed with the intent of make rank something to be proud of as well as something to be earned.

(F) Many STARFLEET chapters may have several members at Commander rank, but the rank may have been easily obtained and thus mean very little to the member. Like on our support ship, the U.S.S. Columbus you work for it, so wear it proudly!

§ 9305.02 Rank Structure.

Ranks for the Maximillian upon attaining Shuttlecraft status with STARFLEET will be as follows:

§ 9305.03 Rank Policy.

(A) Unless a member holds a rank from a previous membership of any STARFLEET chapter, or if a member is granted a rank by the commanding officer of the support ship, U.S.S. *Colossus*, no individual who is a member of the Maximillian will be granted any rank until the Maximillian officially becomes a shuttle.

(B) All ranks earned from chapters to which you were previously a member, if higher than what is authorized by the Maximillian team leader will be recognized by the Maximillian, provided that said member who holds an officer's rank has passed STARFLEET Officers' Training School (OTS). ALL COMMISSIONED OFFICERS OF THE MAXIMILLIAN MUST HAVE PASSED AT LEAST OTS.

(C) Only ranks that are legitimately granted from other STARFLEET Chapters, or by STARFLEET executive committee will be recognized by the Maximillian. Rank granted from chapters of other Star Trek fan associations such as IFT, Starfleet Command (not to be confused with STARFLEET), and independent chapters with no association to any state, national, or international organization, to

name a few; are not recognized by the Maximillian upon transfer.

(D) Upon Maximillian's commissioning from shuttle status to full starship status, all STARFLEET members belonging to Shuttle Maximillian at the time of commissioning will be granted 80 promotion points towards their next rank.

(E) All STARFLEET members who join the Maximillian after her commissioning as a full-status STARFLEET chapter shall hold the entry rank of CREWMAN RECRUIT.

(F) Upon completion of OTS, Officer Candidates are promoted to the rank of ENSIGN, provided the individual is age sixteen (16) years or older. From there, they will be promoted as prescribed in the promotion system detailed in §9305.04 and §9305.05.

(G) Upon completion of OTS or STARFLEET Academy Cadet School (SACS), Officer Candidates who are age ten (10) years of age, but have not yet had their sixteenth (16) birthday will be promoted to the rank of CADET FOURTH CLASS. From there, they will be promoted as prescribed in the promotion system detailed in §9305.04 and §9305.05. Officer Candidates who are below the age of (10) will hold the midshipman ranks as detailed in §9305.05(K) through §9305.05(W).

(H) During correspondence between members, no mention of rank or position shall be used on the envelope, especially in cases where a member to whom the letter is from or to whom the letter is being sent may be a soldier, sailor, marine or airman in the United States Military; or if the letter is to a citizen of another country.

(I) Trouble may result from a letter in which Private Jones is referred to Lieutenant Jones.

(J) A citizen of some nations who would receive a letter referring to him as a military officer or enlisted personnel, especially if he had never served in the military, could get into considerable trouble.

(G) Military Enlisted members or prior service Enlisted men will receive an entry-level rank into this Organization equivalent to the rank they currently hold or last rank they held in the military, in honor of their service to the country.

(H) Military Officers or former military officers will receive the entry-level rank of Chief Petty Officer, until they have successfully completed Officers Training School. Upon successful completion of OTS, this member will be promoted to the equivalent rank to that which they hold in the actual service or the rank that they last held in the service--SO LONG AS THAT RANK IS AT OR BELOW COMMANDER/LIEUTENANT COLONEL. If the rank is above this level, then the officer in question shall hold the rank of Commander, until promoted higher by STARFLEET.

9305.04 Promotion Points.

To make promotions fair and unbiased, a system of earning promotion points has been adopted by most chapters of STARFLEET. After serious consideration concerning point values, the proceeding activities will have the following point values:

- (f) Junior College.
- (g) College.
- (h) University.

(D) 5 POINTS.

(1) General Membership meetings.

(2) Command Staff Meetings.

(3) Maximillian Role-Playing Game sessions [Details still to be worked out with for this with the Gaming group].

(5) First Officer Report [First Officer or Acting First Officer Only].

(1) Appointed by STARFLEET Executive Committee.

(2) Must be a member of STARFLEET in good standing.

(AN) FLEET ADMIRAL [FADM].

(1) Elected by majority vote by STARFLEET membership. Details covering the vote for Fleet Admiral are found in the Membership Handbook and the STARFLEET Constitution.

(2) Must be a member in good standing with STARFLEET.

E 9305.06 Promotion Boards.

(A) Before any individual receives a promotion, said member must pass a promotion board, which will review the individual's activity record to see whether or not he or she had met the requirements for promotion to the next rank.

(B) Procedure for calling a promotion board for a member is as follows:

(1) When a member has fulfilled the prescribed requirements in §9305.05 for his next rank, he fills out a promotion application and turns it in to his Division Officer.

(a) If the applicant is a Division Officer, then he must turn the application in to the Executive Officer.

(2) If the Division Officer concurs

with the information provided according to his records, and approves the application for review, the Division Officer presents the promotion application to the Executive Officer. A date, time and place (usually just before the next membership meeting begins) is then determined by the Division Officer, Executive Officer, and Commanding Officer.

(3) The Promotion Board is held with the applicant, reviewing the activity level of the applicant, time in grade, and promotion points.

- (h) Promotion boards for applicants for ranks LT, and LCDR shall consist of the following members:
- (1) Executive Officer.

- (2) Second Officer.
- (3) Two other Division Officers.
- (i) Promotion boards for applicants for rank of CDR shall consist of the following members:
- (1) Commanding Officer (Presiding).
- (2) Command Staff.
- (4) Approval for promotion by the board must be unanimous before forwarding it to the Commanding Officer.
- (5) Application for promotion is presented to the Commanding Officer along with the individual's record for his approval.
- (6) Disapproval at any level from the Division Officer to the Commanding Officer must be explained in writing. Reasons for not promoting an individual may not be of a personal nature.
- (7) Upon approval of the Commanding Officer, the promotion is presented at the following Captain's Mast.

§ 9305.07 Captain's Mast.

- (A) Captain's Mast is held once every three months to recognize individuals for receiving promotion in rank.
- (B) Captain's Masts are held at the general membership meetings of the following months:
- (1) March
- (2) June
- (3) September
- (4) December

CHAPTER 9306: MEETING PROTOCOL

§ 9306.01 General.

- (A) This chapter was created to enhance the atmosphere of "starship" discipline during chapter meetings, to enhance the personal importance of "rank" within the Organization, and to encourage members to become more active in the promotion system.

(B) Though this chapter seems somewhat militaristic in nature, no member is required to call another who is superior in rank "sir" or "ma'am," nor are they required to salute any higher ranking member. Addressing one by his rank or position should be used as a way to acknowledge another member's achievements and tenure within the organization.

Presented here in this column is the proposed regulations for this organization. With the exception of those regulations specified by STARFLEET, these regulations are not set in stone. It is my intention to present these regulations to all the members as a whole. Read them carefully, and bring this newsletter to the meeting. We will discuss them, revise them, etc. before etching them into stone. Sorry for the fine print, but I wanted to save time, paper and money in printing these up and presenting them to you. CHAPTER 9300:
GENERAL

I 9300.01 Name of the Organization.

As of 05 DEC 1993, per majority vote of the membership at the time, the name of this organization shall be Pre-Launch Team Maximillian (Hertimaster called "Maximillian" or the "Launch Team"). The chapter will be based on the Nebula-Class Light Cruiser as seen in Star Trek: The Next Generation episodes "The Wounded" (USS Phoenix shown); "Redemption, Part II" (USS Sutherland shown); and in Star Trek: Deep Space Nine episodes "The Emissary"; and "Second Sight" (USS Prometheus shown).

The Maximillian is named after the robot assistant to Dr. Hans Reinhardt aboard the U.S.S. Cygnus in Walt Disney's science fiction motion picture *The Black Hole*. The Organization shall hold said name until such time the Organization is granted a pending chapter charter by STARFLEET: The International Star Trek Fan Association, or due to the following conditions:

- (A) The Majority of the membership decides to change the name of the organization by a majority vote by the membership;
- (B) The membership Organization, after being launched as a STARFLEET shuttle, and approaches date of commissioning, will be given an opportunity to decide whether or not to keep the name of Maximillian, or to vote on a new name.

I 9300.02 Definitions.

As used in these regulations, and in honor of Star Trek, this organization is based upon the format of the Federation military and exploratory fleet depicted in Star Trek, Star Trek: The Next Generation, Star Trek: Deep Space Nine, and all Star Trek feature films; and as a reflection of this format, the following terms shall be defined in the following manner:

- (A) "Starship" refers to a Chapter of STARFLEET.
- (B) "Shuttle" refers to a Pending Chapter of STARFLEET.
- (C) "Pre-Launch Team" refers to any organization petitioning for Pending Chapter status within STARFLEET.
- (D) "Commanding Officer" refers to the Chapter Chairperson of a STARFLEET chapter.

(E) "Shuttle Commander" refers to the Chairperson of a STARFLEET Pending Chapter.

(F) "Executive Officer" refers to the Vice Chairperson of a chapter of STARFLEET.

(G) "Launch-Team Commander" refers to the Chairperson of an organization petitioning to become a Pending Chapter of STARFLEET.

(H) "Shuttle Executive Officer" refers to the Vice Chairperson of a Pending Chapter of STARFLEET.

(I) "Launch Team Executive Officer" refers to the Vice Chairperson of an organization petitioning to become a Pending Chapter of STARFLEET.

(J) "Division Officer" refers to an officer who is the commander of a division within the Organization.

(K) "Department Officer" refers to an officer who is in charge of a department within a division.

I 9300.03 Support Ship.

According to the regulations specified by STARFLEET Shuttle Operations Command (ShOC), the support ship for the Launch Team will be the U.S.S. Columbus (NCC-1016). The Columbus shall be the support ship for the Launch Team until full chapter status is granted by STARFLEET.

I 9300.04 Objectives and Purposes.

- (A) To actively pursue unity and brotherhood among members through the promotion of Star Trek; its goals and concepts.
- (B) To cooperate to the fullest possible extent with other Star Trek fan organizations whose objectives are the same.
- (C) To establish a system of mutual assistance, both within STARFLEET and with other organizations.
- (D) To promote the general good and welfare of the members of the Organization.
- (E) To aid in bringing about and maintaining harmony in developing a spirit of kinship among the people who are devoted to the ideals of Star Trek; peace and prosperity for all mankind.
- (F) To bring together in a common association, all organizations and individuals interested in the aforementioned

objectives.

I 9300.05 Requirements for maintaining Chapter Status Within STARFLEET: The International Star Trek Fan Association.

This regulation is required according to STARFLEET regulations:

(A) Shuttle Membership Requirements.

(1) To become a shuttle and to maintain shuttle status, the launch team must have at least five members of STARFLEET.

(2) Only two members per family membership can be counted.

(B) Starship Requirements.

(1) In order to become and remain a starship, the chapter must have a minimum of 10 STARFLEET members.

I 9300.06 STARFLEET operational status.

There are three operational levels a STARFLEET chapter may be classified under:

(A) DEPLOYED STATUS.

(1) This classification is for all STARFLEET chapters that are meeting all criteria for continued operations.

(a) Reports are on time.

(b) Crew is at minimum required strength or better.

(c) The Command Crew has met and passed all requirements by STARFLEET.

(B) STAND BY STATUS.

(1) Chapters on Stand By status are chapters where the following situations apply:

(a) Chapters in the process of changing command officers.

(b) Chapters which have fallen below required crew strengths failing to meet STARFLEET guidelines for deployed status.

(2) Chapters may remain on Stand By status for no longer than sixty [60] days, after which, it is Decommissioned.

(C) DECOMMISSIONED STATUS.

(1) Chapters classified as Decommissioned have been removed from the fleet roster and the crew reassigned to other ships or departments.

(2) Members of Decommissioned ships may elect to form shuttles attached to other ships in the region as long as they meet all the requirements for the Shuttlecraft Program.

**CHAPTER 9301
MEMBERSHIP**

I 9301.01 Membership Policy.

(A) Membership of the Maximillian shall be open to any individual supporting and sustaining the objectives set forth in § 9300.04 LTMaxReg, and conforming to the requirements hereinafter set forth in these regulations.

(B) Membership applications shall be open to all Star Trek fans without regard to race, religion, sex, age, or national origin.

(C) Although the words "He", "Him", and "His" are used throughout these regulations to enhance communication, they are in no way intended to affront and/or discriminate against any gender.

I 9301.02 Membership Requirements.

To make membership as equal as possible, all members of the Maximillian must be members of STARFLEET: The International Star Trek Fan Association, except in the following case:

(A) STARFLEET MARINES.

(1) Because STARFLEET requires a minimum of ten [10] members of STARFLEET to remain a chapter, STARFLEET Marines are strongly encouraged to be members of STARFLEET. Despite this, Marines have a choice of the following membership options:

(a) STARFLEET Marines have the option to be members of both STARFLEET: The

International Star Trek Fan Association and STARFLEET MARINES INTERNATIONAL.

(1) This option is recommended most. This will aid in accomplishing Regulations § 9300.05 through § 9300.06.

(2) This option provides the most for members who wish to be Marines. They are listed on the ship's report to STARFLEET for membership strength.

(3) This option allows Marines to become a Marine Strike Group Leader, should an opening for the position arise.

(b) STARFLEET Marines have the option to be a member of STARFLEET: The International Star Trek Fan Association only.

(1) This option is the next recommended option, and is less expensive than belonging to both SMI and STARFLEET both.

(2) This option allows a Marine to be counted as a member on the ship's roster when reports are made to STARFLEET, and still have the rights and privileges to take any Starfleet

Marine examination course published by SMI.

(c) STARFLEET Marines have the option to be a member of STARFLEET MARINES INTERNATIONAL in lieu of membership to STARFLEET.

(1) Members who pursue this option will not be counted as members of the chapter on any report to STARFLEET, but will be promoted according to STARFLEET MARINES, and they will not have the option to eventually become a Marine Strike Group Leader, should an opening arise.

(2) This option cannot be taken unless a Marine Strike Group is assigned to the Maximillian.

(1) STARFLEET Marines must belong to STARFLEET, SMI, or both. No member can be a Marine without being a member of either international organization or both.

(2) Any Marine Strike Group Leader must be a member of both STARFLEET and SMI organizations.

§ 9301.03 Classification.

Persons who qualify as otherwise provided in Chapter 9301 of Pending Chapter Regulations shall be eligible to membership. There shall be three (3) classes of membership.

(A) ACTIVE DUTY MEMBERSHIP.

(1) Current STARFLEET members that wish to hold rank (participating in the Promotion System), hold a "fictional" position on board the

"ship", and actively pursue the more futuristic atmosphere of a fleet structure as proposed by the Star Trek universe.

(B) ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIP.

(1) Current STARFLEET Members that do not wish to have a "rank" or "position" on board the "ship", but are active in the community service projects and other chapter activities.

(a) Associate members may hold elected positions.

(b) Associate members shall NOT be assigned ranks or fictional positions.

(c) Associate Members may be referred to as "Ambassadors".

(C) HONORARY MEMBERSHIP.

(1) Honorary memberships are given to one who, in the opinion of the members of the Maximillian, has done an outstanding job in advancing the objectives of the Maximillian and STARFLEET.

(2) Honorary Members maybe assigned honorary "reserve" ranks. They shall NOT be assigned fictional positions.

**CHAPTER 9301:
COMMAND STAFF**

9302.01 Command Staff.

The governing body of the Launch Team, the Executive Staff, shall consist of the following designated positions:

(A) The "Shuttle Commander" shall be the Pending Chapter Chairperson.

(B) The "Shuttle Executive Officer" shall be the Pending Chapter Vice Chairperson.

(C) The "Second Officer" shall be the Pending Chapter's Chief Operations Officer.

(D) The "Third Officer" shall be the Pending Chapter's Chief Engineering Officer.

(E) The Senior Officers' Staff of the launch team shall consist of the Division Officers. Order of seniority is as follows:

(1) COMMANDING OFFICER

Commander

(2) EXECUTIVE OFFICER

First Officer

(3) CHIEF OPERATIONS OFFICER

Second Officer

(4) CHIEF SECURITY OFFICER

Third Officer

(5) CHIEF ENGINEERING OFFICER

Fourth Officer

(6) SCIENCE OFFICER

Fifth Officer

(7) MEDICAL OFFICER

Sixth Officer

(8) CHIEF OF SPECIAL SERVICES

Seventh Officer

(9) CADET CORPS COMMANDANT

Eighth Officer

(F) Division officers cannot run for elected positions such as Ship's Records Officer, Ship's Purser, or Ship's Civil Relations Officer.

9302.02 Command Staff Board.

A Command Staff Board of the launch team shall consist of the Commanding Officer, Executive Officer, Division Officers, Records Officer, Purser, and Civil Relations Officer.

**CHAPTER 9303:
MEETINGS**

9303.01 Monthly General Membership Meetings.

(A) Monthly meetings of the Launch Team shall be held at a pre-determined location on the fourth Saturday of each month, at a specified location scheduled during the previous monthly meeting.

(B) While a Launch Team or a Shuttle, At all monthly meetings, five [5] members shall constitute a quorum.

(C) A Quorum shall be required to enact any new policy or to substitute any vote.

(D) Upon attaining Full Chapter Status, the number required for a quorum shall increase to ten [10].

9303.02 Command Staff Meetings.

In order to prepare for the general monthly meeting, the Command Staff Meeting (ESM) shall be held at locations as scheduled during the previous month's Executive Staff Meeting. ESMs must be held prior to the General Membership Meeting.

§ 9303.03 Divisional and Special Interest Group Meetings.

- (A) All Division Officers and special interest groups may hold meetings and activities outside those prescribed in §9303.01 and §9301.02, so long as the commanding officer or first officer knows it is being held in advance, and that a sign-in sheet is presented to them at the earliest convenience.
- (B) No Divisional or Special Interest Group meetings or activities may be held at the same time as the monthly general meeting without the consent of the commanding officer.

§ 9303.04 Announcement of meeting time and place.

This is usually done at the previous meeting, however reminders should be sent out at least one to two weeks prior to the next meeting.

**CHAPTER 9304:
OFFICERS' RESPONSIBILITIES**

§ 9304.01 Launch Team Unrestricted Line Officers.

- (A) Unrestricted Line Officers are members who hold the ranks of Ensign and above, who are in line to command the Launch Team should the Launch Team Commander, and Launch Team Executive Officer be absent and unable to perform their duties.
- (B) Unrestricted Line Officers include all Command Grade and Division Officers listed here in order of seniority from highest to lowest:
 - (1) Launch Team Commanding Officer.
 - (2) Launch Team Executive Officer.
 - (3) Chief Operations Officer.
 - (4) Chief Security Officer.
 - (5) Chief Engineering Officer.
 - (6) Science Officer.
 - (7) Chief Medical Officer.
 - (8) Chief of Special Services.

§ 9304.02 Petitioning Organization Chairperson [LTC].

- (A) The Petitioning Organization Chairperson (henceforth called Launch Team Commander, or LTC) is responsible for the coordination and the conduct of the entire organization.
- (B) The LTC is responsible for organizing the Launch Team (Petitioning Organization) in an effective manner and generate an atmosphere that reflects the spirit of Star Trek.
- (C) The LTC presides at all meetings of the organization and signs all the records thereof.
 - (1) If the LTC attends a divisional meeting, he may act as an advisor to the Division Officer, however the Division Officer of that particular division shall preside over the divisional meeting.
 - (2) If the LTC attends a special interest group meeting, then the leader of that group shall preside over that particular meeting.
- (D) The LTC appoints all divisional officers, authorizes transfers,
