



November 28, 2001 — On Sept. 14, Ohio University student Bryan Randolph decided he could no longer watch footage of the Sept. 11 attacks. Located in Athens, Ohio, his college seemed a long way off from the victims. Wanting to assist handson, Randolph called his mother and said was thinking of dropping his quarter classes and going to New York to help.

"I think you should go", his mother replied.

Later that week Randolph left for New York City. On the first of two independent trips, Randolph volunteered with several relief agencies before deciding to join the American Red Cross at Ground Zero. During his second trip, Randolph realized that much more help was needed and returned to Athens to recruit more student volunteers.



With donations received from passing out candles, Randolph and his friends organized the Ohio Students United For New York (OSUNY) relief group. The group of volunteers headed to New York City the weekend of Oct. 5.

OSUNY immediately began working in several different Red Cross operations throughout Ground Zero. Some students worked in kitchens, while others drove Emergency Response Vehicles (ERVs) to distribute food and water.

By the time the group returned to Ohio a few weeks later, word had spread of the students' accomplishments.

"When I got back there were emails and phone calls like you wouldn't believe from people who wanted to help",said Randolph:

OSUNY quickly developed into a statewide relief effort as students from across Ohio contacted Randolph, offering their assistance. Ohio University President Robert Glidden personally paid for a charter bus to transport the group, now consisting of students from both Ohio University and Ohio State University, back to New York.

On its fourth trip, OSUNY operated a respite center at Ground Zero, where they provided everything from hot meals to sleeping quarters for the exhausted firemen and construction crews. The students worked tirelessly to provide anything they could to the workers.

"I am so proud. I feel like a father. It's hard work but it's incredibly rewarding. I will never forget one day, Sept. 23. I was working on an ERV with some friends when a fireman came up to one of us. He just hugged her and started crying", Randolph recalled. More than one month after its founding, OSUNY continues its work at Ground Zero and other disasters, including the Nov. 13 crash of Flight 587.

The relief group has grown dramatically since its September beginning. "I have over 1,000 people from across the nation who want to help",said Randolph:

Randolph also has been working with Ohio University to develop a disaster relief curriculum. "The program will provide a core group of volunteers trained in disaster relief who are ready to respond anytime. We'll help rebuild from disasters", he explained. "That's the quality I like most about the Red Cross. It comes to a disaster and rebuilds."

Hoping to pursue a career in disaster relief, Randolph Randolph is still in New York helping victims from the tragedies of Sept. 11 and Flight 587. "I plan on staying here, helping the Red Cross, until they kick me out."



This weekend is TNN's
"Star Gazing On Star Trek:
The Next Generation Marathon," hosted by Patrick

Stewart ("Jean-Luc Picard"), as the Star Trek: The Next Generation star introduces episodes featuring celebrities (see story here).

December, TNN will continue with having "mini-marathons" of TNG, with three Sundays in December featuring interesting combinations of episodes.

On Sunday, December 9th, 3:00-8:00 p.m. ET/PT, TNN gives us "Romance on Board," with episodes featuring a love, lust, or romance theme. Episodes included are "Haven," "We'll Always Have Paris," "Manhunt," "The Host" and "In Theory."

Two weeks later on Sunday December 23rd from 3:00-8:00 p.m. ET/PT, it's "All in the Family" with TNG episodes featuring storylines involving family, including "The Icarus Factor," "Family," "Dark Page," "Inheritance" and "Bloodlines."

One week later, on Sunday December 30th from 3:00-8:00 p.m. ET/PT the mini-marathon focuses on "Strange Effects." Each episode features bizarre forces affecting the crew of the U.S.S. Enterprise-D, including "The Naked Now," "Unnatural Selection," "Night Terrors," "Conundrum" and "Rascals."

All times and dates are tentative and subject to change, check your local listings.

#### 12.04.01 Celebrity Open House to Benefit 9/11 Disaster Relief

A slew of celebrities will be signing autographs and auctioning personal memorabilia for charity this weekend during an open house at the Light Speed Fine Arts gallery in Laguna Hills, California.

About 20 Star Trek stars including George Takei ("Sulu"), Nichelle Nichols ("Uhura"), John de Lancie ("Q"), Armin Shimerman ("Quark"), Nicole deBoer ("Ezri Dax") and Robert Picardo ("The Doctor") are set to attend the event December 8-9 which will feature live and silent auctions of memorabilia donated by the actors and by the studio, plus a special exhibit of the highly praised blackand-white photography of Leonard Nimoy.

Ticket prices are \$50 for one day or \$90 for both. Net proceeds from ticket sales will be donated to the Red Cross to benefit September 11 Disaster Relief. The celebrities will charge nominal fees for autographs, a portion of which will also be donated to the charities of their choice. More information is available at the Light Speed website.

Other Star Trek VIP's slated to attend include Grace Lee Whitney ("Janice Rand"), Gary Lockwood ("Gary Mitchell"), Denise Crosby ("Tasha Yar"), Patti Yasutake ("Nurse

Ogawa"), Jennifer Hetrick ("Vash"), Robert O'Reilly ("Gowron"), Max Grodénchick Aron Eisenberg ("Nog"), Chase Masterson ("Leeta"), J.G. Hertzler ("Martok"), de Lancie's son Keegan ("Q2" in "Q2"); plus Patricia Tallman, stuntwoman and frequent guest star since Star Trek: The Next Generation, and former pre-production and script coordinator Lolita Fatjo. Light Speed, a common presence in dealers' rooms at Star Trek conventions, deals in collectible art, lithographs, chromagraphs, murals and posters featuring stars and scenes from various science fiction movies and TV shows, often hand-signed by the artist or by cast members.

# 12.05.01 William Shatner Set as Capo of "DumbFellas"



William Shatner ("James T. Kirk") has starred in films and television shows ranging from westerns to cop shows to cooking shows to, of

course, groundbreaking science fiction, and now the actor is set to play a Mafia boss in the upcoming comedy "DumbFellas."

Described in the Hollywood Reporter as "Dumb & Dumber" meets "GoodFellas," the film is to be produced by Shatner's manager Larry Thompson.

Other projects Shatner has in the works include "Groom Lake," a science fiction film in which Shatner serves triple duty- writing, directing and acting; a role in "American Psycho II" plus his hosting duties on UPN's Iron Chef USA.

Recent Shatner highlights include the release of his "Mind Meld" video (see related story here), plus an appearance on a Star Trek edition of NBC's Weakest Link.

## 12.06.01 Star Trek's "Christmas Carol" Connection

The connection between Star Trek and Charles Dickens' "A Christmas Carol" continues to grow. Along with the acclaimed one-man version done by Star Trek: The Next Generation's Patrick Stewart ("Jean-Luc Picard," see related story here), several other productions of the holiday classic in Southern California this season feature Star Trek alums. Reprising the role of Scrooge for a third consecutive year at the Santa Susanna Repertory Company is Original Series veteran Walter Koenig ("Pavel Chekov"). Playing at the Scherr Forum Theatre in the Thousand Oaks Civic Arts Plaza in Thousand Oaks, California, the Koenig-starring version of "A Christmas Carol" runs through December 22.

Moving on down the coast, several other Star

Trek alums appear in the South Coast Repertory version of "A Christmas Carol." Playing Scrooge at the South Coast Rep is Hal Landon Jr., who appeared as Neral in the Star Trek: Deep Space Nine episode "Inter Arma Enim Silent Leges."

Playing the Young Scrooge in the same production is TNG and Star Trek: Voyager alum Jonathan Del Arco (Hugh in the TNG episodes "I, Borg" and "Descent, Part II," as well as Fantome in the Voyager episode "The Void") and playing Scrooge's nephew Fred is Howard Shangraw, who played Tolar in the DS9 episode "In the Pale Moonlight."

#### 12.06.01 Back to the Past for "Nemesis" Writer

Now that he's forayed into the future with "Star Trek: Nemesis" and "The Time Machine,"



screenwriter John Logan is heading back into the past with two wartime movies that he has been hired to write, one of which will be directed by Steven Spielberg.

The Oscar-nominated co-writer of "Gladiator" has made a deal with DreamWorks SKG to write two more high-profile historical epics. The Spielberg picture will be a biography of Abraham Lincoln focusing on how the 16th U. S. president steered the country through the Civil War, according to Daily Variety. (As another, albeit off-handed, connection to Star Trek, Lincoln was a hero of Captain Kirk's who appeared in the Original Series episode The Savage Curtain.") Logan is also scripting another true story taking place during World War II, in which a team of Allied commandos fighting the Germans on a Greek island form an unlikely alliance with a group of Eastern Orthodox monks.

Logan wrote the screenplay for the tenth Star Trek feature film based on an original story conceived by himself, Brent Spiner and Rick Berman. "Nemesis" is currently in production at Paramount Studios and is slated for a 2002 release. He also penned the script for the DreamWorks/Warner Bros. co-production of H.G. Wells' "The Time Machine" which is scheduled for release in March 2002. According to Variety, the busy Logan also wrote an animated film for DreamWorks, "Sinbad," which is currently in production, and yet another historical epic, "The Last Samurai," about the modernization of Japan, for Warner Bros. He has also written a biopic about Howard Hughes to star Leonardo Di-Caprio.

Logan (along with two co-writers) received a Best Screenplay nomination at the Academy Awards earlier this year for "Gladiator," and while he didn't take home that trophy, the movie did win Best Picture for the year.
