Shatner Marries for the 4th Time

February 15, 2001
LEBANON, Ind. -- Normalcy can return to Boone County now that actor William Shatner and a onetime Lebanon High School homecoming queen have tied the knot. Shatner, 69, also known as Capt. James T. Kirk of Star Trek fame, had been the talk of the county seat since he and Elizabeth "Liz" Martin, 42, picked up their marriage license on Monday at the courthouse in Lebanon. The couple tied the knot on Tuesday, according to Martin's sister, Gayle Anderson. "It's absolutely true," Ander-

son said Wednesday. "That's all we're saying," she said from the rural Whitestown home of her parents, Dorothy and Daniel Anderson. The wedding was held Tuesday to avoid speculation of a Valentine's Day wedding and further media spotlight. Martin, who now lives in California, graduated from Lebanon High School in 1977 and was homecoming queen that year. This is the fourth marriage for Shatner, who starred as Captain James T. Kirk in the

"Star Trek" television series and movies. His third wife, model Nerine Kidd, died Aug. 9, 1999, when she drowned in the swimming pool at the couple's Los Angeles home. Shatner's first two marriages ended in divorce. Shatner, who recently co-starred in the beauty-pageant parody, "Miss Congeniality", is set to host the 50th annual Miss USA pageant in Gary on March 2. Preliminary taping for the show starts this week.

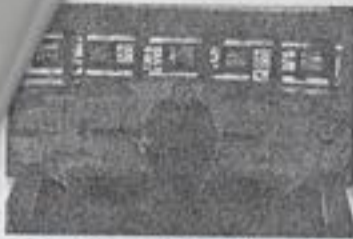

Greetings Earthlings,

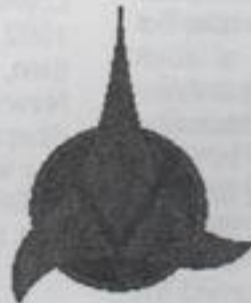
Hello again from the center seat. I'll get started because I have several things to cover.

1997 -- In Guthrie, Okla., in October, Jason Heck tried to kill a millipede with a shot from his .22-caliber rifle, but the bullet ricocheted off a rock near the insect's hole and hit pal Antonio Martinez in the head, fracturing his skull. And in Elyria, Ohio, in October, Martyn Eskins, attempting to clean out cobwebs in his basement, declined to use a broom in favor of a propane torch and caused a fire that burned the first and second floors of his house.

1994 -- In September, a 24-year-old man being chased by a police officer from a Beverly Hills, Calif., house that he was suspected of burglarizing ran into a tree branch and knocked himself unconscious. 02.12.01 Dispatch: *Star Trek* Fan Club Gets "Decipher"-ed

Decipher Inc. has acquired the assets of FANTastic Media (founders and operators of the Official *Star Trek* Fan Club and publishers of the *Star Trek* Communicator magazine). Decipher has also hired the entire FANTastic Media staff.

"FANTastic Media is the finest and most prestigious Fan Club organization in the world," said Warren Holland, Decipher CEO. "We are very happy to have Dan Madsen (FANTastic Media President) and his talented team in the Decipher family. Our immediate focus is to give *Star Trek* fans a new and improved Fan Club with features that will substantially increase services and membership."

Decipher also announced a long-term license from Viacom Consumer Products to continue to build and expand the *Star Trek* Fan Club.

Also among the assets acquired by Decipher from FANTastic Media is the *Star Trek* Fan Club's online store, (hosted online at STARTREK.COM here), the *Star Trek* Communicator magazine and catalog, all the *Star Trek* Fan Club's membership base, and the award-winning staff that created and managed the *Star Trek* Fan Club for over 20 years.

Farrell in *Becker*

Leonard Nimoy ("Mr. Spock") has come back to the Paramount lot to join another *Star Trek* alumnus, Terry Farrell ("Jadzia Dax" in *Star Trek: Deep Space Nine*), in an episode of the CBS sitcom *Becker*.

Shooting Tuesday night before a live studio audience, Nimoy's guest appearance is nostalgic in a number of ways. The sound stage where *Becker* is produced is the very same stage where the original *Star Trek* was filmed. Plus, Nimoy reunites with Ted Danson, whom he directed in the box-office hit "Three Men and a Baby."

In this *Becker* episode, Nimoy plays Professor Emmett Fowler, a professor from Harvard who was a mentor to Dr. Becker (Danson). He is in town for a book signing, and as Becker and Reggie (Farrell) rush to meet him, the gruff doctor reminisces fondly about how Fowler made him his protégé. However, when they approach Fowler, Becker is devastated that his mentor doesn't remember him or the impact he had on him.

An airdate for the episode has not yet been determined.

02.05.01 Dispatch: *Frasier* Pokes Fun at Trekkers

Star Trek fans will get a little good-natured teasing this week from a sister Paramount production. The opening scene of Tuesday night's *Frasier* shows the title character visiting a science fiction convention where he encounters die-hard fans, including Trekkers in costume.

In the episode, titled "The Show Must Go Off," Frasier Crane (Kelsey Grammer) is at a convention searching for a comic book for his son, running into amateur Klingons, Vulcans and the like. While there he finds a Shakespearean actor, whom he idolized as a child, signing autographs because that actor—played by Sir Derek Jacobi—was a cast member in a fictional science fiction series (much in the vein of "Galaxy Quest"). Frasier and his brother Niles then embark upon a plan to revitalize the actor's career in classical theatre, and naturally, complications ensue.

Of course, the star of *Frasier* is no stranger to the world of *Star Trek*. Grammer did a cameo appearance on *Star Trek: The Next Generation* as Captain Morgan Bateson in the episode "Cause and Effect", and therefore as an alumnus, has been frequently mentioned on STARTREK.COM because of his numerous award nominations and wins, including a Golden Globe last month.

Star Trek V a Go

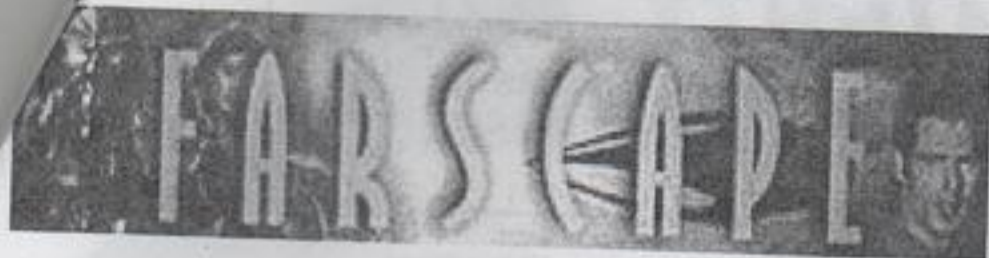
After years of speculation, it now finally seems to be official: the next *Star Trek* series will launch on UPN in Fall 2001, just over half a year from now.

According to Rick Ellis, a media analyst at financial network On24, Viacom announced this at a conference with financial analysts yesterday, discussing their fourth-quarter earnings. "They did officially say, yes, there was going to be a next *Star Trek* series in the fall," said Ellis. "They were a little vague on what it is going to be, but one of the things that came out in the press conference this morning was that there was going to be a next *Star Trek*."

In addition to *Star Trek*, the press conference also dealt with UPN, the network that will be carrying Series V. According to Ellis, "they were generally happy about [UPN]. They seemed to think it was going to be around for a while. There were some questions about it, but it looks like they've managed to secure enough deals [that] UPN is going to be around for a couple more years."

The fact that Viacom has now officially confirmed that Series V will debut in Fall gives credence to recent rumors that suggested Paramount was scheduled to begin pre-production in just a couple of weeks. Rick Berman himself also recently said that he thought production on the pilot would begin in March and April, though he did note that the possibility of writers' and actors' strikes might delay the start of the next series, which of course is still a danger. Even if there are strikes, though, it seems Viacom is at least committed to the next series, and it seems fairly cer-

Formally a front-line soldier in the Peacekeeper corps, Aeryn was part of the kick-ass Pleisar Regiment, which was always the first unit in. Aeryn is intensely proud of the fact that she can hold her own among any of her fellow soldiers, male or female. Being trapped aboard Moya and having to count on all these non-Peacekeepers for her survival has been an insult to her warrior instincts and training, but it's forced her to grow as a person, to think bigger and to be better than she was before.

Aeryn was born and bred a Peacekeeper. Her mother and her Father (Talyn) choose to bare a child out of a loving bond, very rare to Peacekeeper soldiers. Aeryn herself has learned to love, she had grown to love and care



that even in her past she had loved and through her strong friendships aboard Moya has learned to slowly open up to John and to Pilot about her past. Though she still keeps them at bay and shuts them out when she feels she needs to.

Aeryn feels closest to Pilot then any other of her fellow crewmates. She had been injected with Pilot's DNA during an encounter with a mad genetic scientist. The transformation was reversed but

for Moya's only offspring, who she named after her father until he was taken away by Crais another former Peacekeeper. She has also revealed

she still retains some of his genetic material. In addition to having a closeness with Pilot she also has the innate, technical knowledge to operate Moya. But Aeryn is still at odds with her Peacekeeper past. It's the only life she's ever known, and even though she's rejected it (and been rejected by it), her pride and sense of knowing her purpose have been wounded. She now sees the Peacekeepers more clearly ruthless, often brutal but her pride was formed mostly out of what they made her, and without them, even realizing their faults, she still has an affinity for them and the place that she lost.

While only specially cleared attendants of Toy Fair get to see the busts in person, here are exclusive photos of the sculptures.

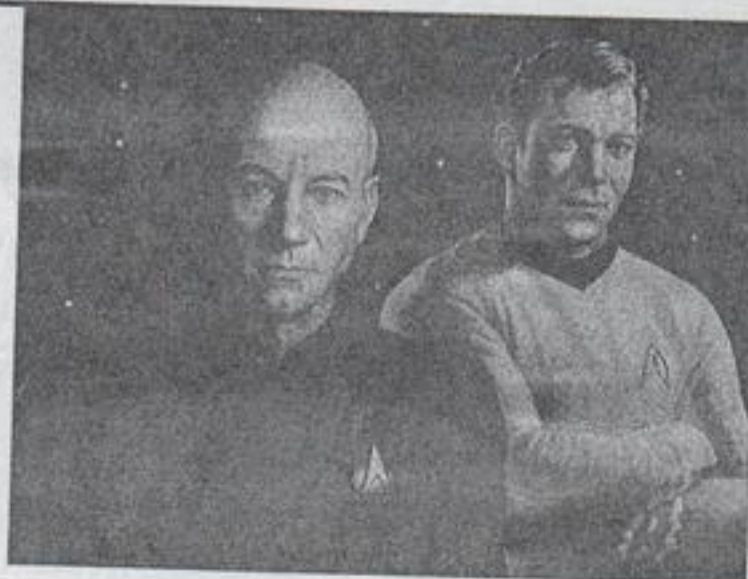

tain now UPN will be the network to carry it whenever it comes out next season.

What isn't certain yet is what the series will deal with, and indeed in most recent interviews Rick Berman refused to give out any information on the actual concept and denied it had already made it to the internet. However, today SFX reported the following info:

The new series, which SFX Network learned this week will be added to the Paramount payroll on February 19, has already had preliminary pre-production work carried out. SFX Network understands, from our Trek spy sources, that the new series will indeed be set in the early days of the Federation - a concept which forms the provisional payroll title for the show within Paramount.
