The History of the Maximillian

JERRY GOLDSMITH 1929-2004

Born February 1929, Jerry Goldsmith studied piano with Jacob Gimpel and composition, theory and counterpoint with Mario Castelnuovo-Tedesco. He also attended classes in film composition given by 'Miklos Rozsa' at the Univeristy of Southern California.

In 1950, he was employed as a clerk typist in the music department at CBS. Here he was given his first embryonic assignments as a composer for radio shows such as 'Romance' and 'CBS Radio Workshop'. He wrote one score a week for these shows which were performed live on transmission. He stayed with CBS until 1960, having already scored "Twilight Zone, The" (1959).

He was hired by Revue Studios to score their <u>"Thriller" (1960)</u> series. It was here that he met the influential film composer <u>Alfred Newman</u> who hired Goldsmith to score the film

Her paternal grandfather was the son of a rich slave-owner who gave up everything to marry a black slave woman. They moved up north and even started a community where people of all races could live together. Sound like a familiar theme? As for her maternal side, she is a quarter Cherokee from her grandfather. Also, while I did know she was a dancer and singer, I never imagined she worked with some of the legends she describes in her book.

A number of years back, I read Star Trek Memories by William Shatner. I also loved this book and felt it was written well. It was extremely interesting to get another point-of-view on what went on back on the original series from Nichelle. Whereas Shatner felt his suggesting changes to the script was merely to make the series better, he claims he did not realize how anyone else felt about it. Nichelle made it very clear that he was trying strictly to further his career and have the show focus upon his character alone (as most shows of the time had a single or double main stars, not an ensemble).

Finally, she actually discussed her relationship with Gene Roddenbery. I had heard rumors that the two had been involved romantically before he'd met Majel but this truly confirmed it. She was very frank but also reserved in a dignified way.

I highly recommend this autobiography. I also recommend reading Shatner's autobiography also for some nice contrast.


July Meeting Minutes

"And as you can see, we are very up to date, and prepared to deal with whatever is thrown at us, out here, in the great unknown."


Skrit walked in front of the camera crew, moving backwards, yet thankfully he was aware enough of his surroundings not to bump into anyone. That would be embarrassing, especially since his every movement, action, and word would be transmitted throughout the quadrant. He was pleased that he had been asked to lead the video tour of the Maximillian, which originally had been a one time thing, started by Admiral Blobbin who believed that the Federation needed another face to Starfleet, other than the usual exploits of the Enterprise. The Maximillian was an obvious choice, not just because it was Admiral T'Kill's flagship, but also because it was an upgraded version of the Sovereign class Starship, and thus it could easily be called the most powerful ship in the fleet.

In addition to this, was the eclectic mix of cultures and crew members that served aboard the Max. Between the Androids, and the Vulcans, and a Betazoid that had recently joined the ship, coming aboard at Deep Space Nine but forgotten during the difficulties that had went on there, it put most ships to shame, since the Federation, though it had thinned out a bit in recent times, was still mostly human. Skrit was no exception, being a strange mix of energy lifeform and hologram, rendering him among the more valuable crewmembers on the Max. His unique abilities with energy made him a popular figure on the initial broadcast of "Starship Life: The U.S.S. Maximillian", which was split between him, Commander Tamak, the first officer of the ship, and LCDR Meowran, A Katian who headed up Stellar Cartography. After the response came in, it ended up with Skrit leading the camera crew around the ship on regular intervals, provided the Max was not on a mission that involved danger or secrecy. Since right now they were merely scanning a nebula, routine work only being done because they were so close to it after leaving Deep Space Nine, it seemed the perfect time to get the camera crew out to do an episode.

So it was that Skrit found himself, on the rare occasion where he wasn't assembling his Rapid Response force or filling a shift on the bridge, leading the crew through the bowels of the ship, telling them about the sights and adventures they had seen, and basically having the time of his life doing it.

He marched purposefully, happily through the decks, oc-

Lonely Are the Brave (1962), his first major feature film score. An experimentalist, Goldsmith constantly pushed forward the bounds of film music: Planet of the Apes (1968) included horns blown without mouthpieces and a bass clarinetist fingering the notes but not blowing.

He rose rapidly to the top of his profession in the early to mid-sixties, with scores such as Freud (1962), Patch of Blue, A (1965) & Sand Pebbles, The (1966). In fact, he received Oscar nominations for all three and another in the sixties for Planet of the Apes (1968). From then onwards his career and reputation was secure and he scored an astonishing variety of films during the next 30 years or so, from Patton (1970) to Star Trek: The Motion Picture (1979) and from Chinatown (1974) to Boys from Brazil, The (1978).

He received 17 Oscar nominations but won only once, for Omen, The (1976) in 1977. He enjoyed giving concerts of his music and performed all over the world, notably in London, where he built up a strong relationship with The London Symphony Orchestra.

He died in July of 2004 after a long battle with cancer.

But there was only one Skrit, one energy being held together by emitters and complicated electronic equipment, one man that had fought the evils of the universe, saved his friends, and had and would be a part of the greatest ship in the fleet, no matter what the latest opinion polls showed. (The Enterprise, as usual running on their name alone, led in just the last weeks poll by a 67% margin. The Maximillian, as usual, out of the limelight, sat at around 5% most of the time, mainly voted on the list in the first place by former crew members and crew family.)

Even for a Vulcan he slept less than most everyone he knew on the ship, and only the androids on board were unconscious for less time. He considered sleep to be a waste of precious resources, though he knew of it's beneficial properties as well. His average was only a scant few hours a day, far less than he knew he should be getting. But he was still able to function at an acceptable level of energy for the majority of the standard day, and throughout many others when a crisis erupted, as was happening all too frequently these days.

Fortunately, in the past couple of weeks, the level of activity had lessened a bit. No invaders or assassins, and no problems with camera crews unintentionally throwing the crew out of sorts. The attentions had returned to something Kelvok did not mind at all, standard exploration and study. The science part of the Federation equation that was too often overshadowed by battles and threats of war. And while his long-hidden Romulan side thirsted for conflict and action, he much preferred this calm, even as he knew that the calm could break into a sudden storm at any time.

But for now, he continued to run on, keeping his strength up and his emotions hidden even from himself, and lost himself in thoughts of the future.

Thoughts moved through his head of the Max's next mission, and even beyond that, to the next shore leave. It had certainly been well earned, since he hadn't had a real leave from the ship since the refit, and even that had only been a few days. Before that, it had been before he had become Captain, just before the incident that had cost the Maximillian several crew members, including an Admiral and a Captain. He thought of the endless possiblities that he could undertake. Returning to Vulcan, visiting the worlds of Alpha Centuari, the ideas moved through Kelvok's brain quickly, and he allowed himself to disappear into the stream of conciousness moving through his mind.

As he expected would be the case, his blissful interlude, or as close to blissful as a Vulcan could get, was shattered by the insistent tone of the comm system, alerting him out of his thoughts and back into the cold reality. As a Starfleet Captain, he was always on call, no matter if he was sitting in the command chair or not. He collected himself, shaking off the last vestiges of the future, and spoke aloud to the room.

The dry tones of the Katarran communications officer, who had all but disappeared



"Enterprise" Crew returns "Home" In Third Episode of new season.

The third episode of STAR TREK: ENTERPRISE's fourth season wrapped last Thursday and the official STAR TREK web site has posted its production report. In addition to confirming the story first reported by Trek-Web several weeks ago, the site also confirms our August 2nd report that original STAR TREK guest actor Jack Donner, who played 'Subcommander Tal' in "The Enterprise Incident" appears in the episode.

The story revolves around the Enterprise crew's return to Earth after successfully averting desctruction at the hands of the Xindi in "Zero Hour" (and presumeably at the hands of alien-assisted Nazis in "Storm Front" parts one and two). While 'Archer' and his crew are celebrated for their successful mission, 'T'Pol' returns to Vulcan to face a potential arranged marriage. Donner plays the role of the Vulcan priest presiding over a wedding ceremony, in fact.

"And we do get to meet 'Koss', the fiancé that T'Pol spoke of in 'Breaking the Ice' whom she ditched to continue serving on Enterprise," writes the site. "Koss is portrayed by **Michael Reilly Burke**, who played the Borg 'Goval'" in TNG's 'Descent, Part II' and the Cardassian 'Hogue' in DS9's 'Profit and Loss.' T'Pol's mother is named 'T'Les,' and she's played by **Joanna Cassidy**. Cassidy is a critically acclaimed actress whose credits also stretch back to M:I and is best known for roles in 'Under Fire,' 'Who Framed Roger Rabbit' and 'Barbarians at the Gate.' She's often remembered as the snakecharming stripper in 'Blade Runner.'"

The report won't reveal whether T'Pol in fact gets married, but describes the wedding ceremony as similar to 'Spock's ritual in the TOS episode "Amok Time," but with no fight-to-the-death this time. According to the site, the episode takes place largely on location or in swing sets doubling for locations such as a new bar in San Francisco, a stadium, the mountains, and Vulcan itself. We'll glimpse the Vulcan "Fire Plains" mentioned by 'Tuvok' in VOY's "Innocence", and the conference room of 'Admiral Forrest' (Vaughn Armstrong reprises his role last seen in "The Expanse") that includes a three-paneled TOS-like viewer.

Gary Graham returns as 'Soval' and Jim Fitzpatrick is back as 'Commander Williams'. Actress Ada Maris rounds out the cast as 'Captain Erika Hernandez', commander of the new Columbia NX-02 and an old flame of Archer's. Allan Kroeker directed Mike Sussman's script.

"Home" airs Friday, October 22nd, on UPN.

Trek Authors come aboard "Enterprise's" Fourth Season

The new-look STAR TREK: ENTERPRISE continues to take shape for the upcoming fourth season. Just as new executive producer **Manny Coto** has promised to bring more ORIGINAL SERIES and NEXT GENERATION ties to the stories on the prequel series, the show now welcomes two writers eminently qualified to deliver on that promise.

TrekWeb has confirmed that **Judith and Garfield Reeves-Stevens** have joined ENTERPRISE as story editors. The Reeves-Stevenses are two of the STAR TREK fiction world's best authors, having written six original TREK novels, four non-fiction entries, and more. They're also well-known for their contribution to the eight 'Captain Kirk' novels co-written by **William Shatner**: THE ASHES OF EDEN, THE RETURN, AVENGER, SPECTRE, DARK VICTORY, PRESERVER, CAPTAIN'S PERIL, and CAPTAIN'S BLOOD. The ninth novel in the series, CAPTAIN'S GLORY, is scheduled for release in 2005.

The Kirk novels are well-known for bringing the various eras of STAR TREK together, putting Kirk with other characters like 'Picard' in adventures that span the galaxy and tie in with innumerable elements of STAR TREK continuity. One of the sharpest criticisms of the prequel series has been its fast-andloose adherence to established STAR TREK canon, a phenomenon that can often doom franchise-based television series and feature films. Most recently, the new film CAT-WOMAN was derided by fans of the comic for deviating from the source material; the film made a poor showing at the box office. The intricate knowledge and sometimes obsessive dedication that franchise fans possess has moved into the mainstream, with Hollywood courting fan favor at huge events like the San Diego Comic Con and reaching unparallelled success with adaptations like the SPIDER-MAN and X-MEN films.

The Reeves-Stevens' other TREK novels include FEDERA-TION, PRIME DIRECTIVE, MEMORY PRIME, and the DEEP SPACE NINE: MILLENNIUM trilogy. Their nonfiction STAR TREK books include THE MAKING OF STAR TREK: DEEP SPACE NINE, THE ART OF STAR TREK, STAR TREK: PHASE II - THE LOST SERIES, and STAR TREK: THE NEXT GENERATION - THE CONTINUING MISSION. In addition, they also wrote an issue of the illustrated NEXT GENERATION comic series for DC Comics. In 2003 they provided a new interview for the Pocket Books omnibus collection WORLDS IN COLLISION, a trade paperback compilation of MEMORY PRIME and PRIME DIRECTIVE. One of their next projects with William Shatner will be the recently-announced STARFLEET ACADEMY novels featuring a young James T. Kirk.
