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

This has been a long time in coming. Long before the Power Rangers and all those shows, there was the show that made cartoons utilize the power of joining individual characters into one MEGA character. Voltron - Defender of the Universe. It has taken many years for this beloved classic to come into DVD for one main reason. The original prints did not exist. Every image and sound was rebuilt from ground zero from two different Japanese series. Color corrections were used and every frame had to be reconstructed using video footage. Anime Works did a tremendous job on this and the clean images are the proof.

The Green Lion, Blue Lion, Yellow Lion, Black Lion, and the Red Lion make up the five lions that transform into Voltron, but they can only do so with the interlocking keys that are needed. Voltron battles the evil forces of Zarkon, Haggar the witch, and Prince Lotar (Zarkon's son).

Join Keith, Lance, Sven, Hunk, and Pidge as they work with Princess Alura to restore freedom to the galaxy.

15 episodes are included on this set, and as if that doesn't appeal to your wallet this will. Special features include the ORIGINAL pilot, the Voltron trilogy, interviews with the staff, the clean-up process and the making of the DVD's, and a full episode synopses with the original air dates from Sep 10, 1984



Summary

For those of you who love quantum physics and Manga here is a new show released on DVD that is totally mind boggling. The lead, Haruka, is an observer. Kind of like The Watcher in the What If comics. Haruka has no idea what is going on, and yet people from an alternate reality are visiting this reality to either destroy or protect Haruka, who may or may not have the power to bring balance to the alternate reality which is fading. In myth, Atlas holds up the heavens, but in this stunning view a mountain appears to serve as the southern night sky pivots around a snowy peak. Recorded during a climbing expedition at an altitude above 19,000 feet (temperature -18 degrees C), the picture places the South Celestial Pole over the Andes mountain Ojos del Salado. Topping out at over 22,000 feet, the Ojos del Salado is a stratovolcano, the highest active volcano on planet Earth. The time exposure lasted an hour and a half, recording the graceful arcing star trails along with the rising Milky Way (left) and setting Magellanic clouds.

The comm came to life as he vanished from sight and a booming voice was heard echoing through the halls of the Maximillian, "Merry Christmas to all, and to all a good night."



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
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Does water STILL flow on Mars?

Does water still flow on Mars? These dramatic new photos seem to indicate yes.

Striking new images of the Red Planet have raised hopes life could be found on Mars after all.



Scientists say they have photographic evidence that suggests liquid water may have been on the planet as little as five years ago.

Experts last night said Mars now appears more active than previously thought and the latest study shows why it is vital to continue to search for life on our planetary neighbour.

The first images of Mars' surface were taken in the 1960s and they suggested it was a dusty, cratered world rather like our Moon.

Now a new set of photographs has suggested that liquid water may have flowed on the planet a mere five years ago.

The discovery resulted from images taken by the Mars Global Surveyor which first recorded gullies and trenches that could have been made by fast-flowing water coursing down cliffs and crater walls.

Scientists in the USA decided to retake images of the gullies to search for any sign of recent activity.

Two of those originally photographed in 1999 and 2001 then photographed again in 2004 and 2005 showed changes consistent with water having flowed down the side of the crater. The discovery was made by scientists at the San Diego-based Malin Space Systems which operated a camera aboard the spacecraft.

Writing in the journal Science, the researchers led by Michael Malin said the properties and settings of the deposits in the gullies are consistent with water flow.

Expert Bruce Jakosky, of the University of Colorado at

Boulder, said the study "underscores the importance of searching for life on Mars, either present or past.

"It's one more reason to think that life could be there," he added.

However Oded Aharonson of the California Institute of Technology urged caution over the findings.

He said the interpretation of the images as water activity was 'compelling' but only one explanation.

Until now the question of liquid water has mainly focused on ancient Mars and on the Martian north pole, where water ice has been detected.

Water along with a stable source of heat is essential for life to emerge.

Mars formed more than 4.5 billion years ago and scientists generally believe it went through an early wet and warm era that ended after 1.5 billion to 2.5 billion years, leaving the planet extremely dry and cold.

Water cannot remain a liquid for long because of subzero surface temperatures and low atmospheric pressure that would turn water into ice or gas.

But some studies have pointed to the possibility of liquid water flowing briefly on the surface through a possible underground water source that periodically shoots up.

with the others, all I have to do with you is change your holoemitter a bit."

"Call her the mistake." T'Kill said quietly.


"Even better. The 'Rehllai"

It will be a matter for subsequent agreement as to which regions in the foregoing categories will be brought under the trusteeship system and upon what terms;

Article 78

The trusteeship system shall not apply to regions which have become members of the United Federation of Planets, relationship among which shall be based on the respect for the principle sovereign equality;

Article 79

The terms of trusteeship for each region to be placed under the trusteeship system, including any alteration or amendment, shall be agreed upon by the social systems directly concerned, including the mandatory power in the case of regions held under mandate by a member of the United Federation, and shall be approved as provided for in articles 83 and 85;

Article 80

- Except as may be agreed upon in individual trusteeship agreements, made under articles 77, 79, and 81,
 placing each region under the trusteeship system, and until such agreements have been concluded, nothing in
 this chapter shall be construed in or of itself to alter in any manner the rights whatsoever of any social systems or any intelligent life0forms or the terms of existing agreements to which members of the United Federation may respectively be parties;
- Paragraph 1 of this article shall not be interpreted as giving grounds for delay or postponement of the negotiation and conclusion of agreements for placing mandated and other regions under the trusteeship system as provided for in article 77;

Article 81

The trusteeship agreement shall in each case include the terms under which the region will be administered and designate the authority which will be exercising the administration of the trust region. Such authority herinafter call the administering authority, may be one or more social systems of the United Federation itself;

Article 82

There may be designated, in the trusteeship agreement, a strategic area or areas which may include part or all of the trust region to which the agreement applies, without prejudice to any special agreement or agreements made under article 43;

Article 83

- All functions of the United Federation relating to strategic areas, including the approval of the terms of
 the trusteeship agreements and of their subsequent alteration or amendment, shall be exercised by the Federation Council.
- 2. The basic principles set forth in article 76 shall apply to the intelligent life-forms of each strategic area;


The Federation Council shall, subject to the provisions of the trusteeship agreements and without prejudice to security considerations, avail itself of the assistance of the trusteeship council to perform those functions of the United Federation under the trusteeship system relation to political, economic, social, and educational matters in the strategic areas;

Article 84

It shall be the duty of the administering authority to ensure that the trust region shall play its part in the maintenance of interplanetary peace and security. To this end the administering authority may make use of volunteer forces, facilities, and assistance from the trust region in carrying out the obligations towards the federation council undertaken in the regard y the administering authority, as well as for the local defense and the maintenance of law and order within the trust region;

Article 85

- The functions of the United Federation with regard to trusteeship agreements for all regions not designated as strategic, including the approval of the terms of the trusteeship agreements and their alteration or amendment, shall be exercised by the supreme assembly;
- The trusteeship council, operating under the authority of the supreme assembly, shall assist the supreme assembly in carrying out these functions.







Articles of the Federation

Chapter XII Interplanetary Trusteeship System

Article 75

The United Federation shall establish under its authority an interplanetary trusteeship system for the administration and supervision of such regions as may be placed thereunder by subsequent individual agreements. These regions are herinafter referred to as trust regions.

Article 76

Te bas objectives of the trusteeship system, in accordance with the purposes and principles of the United Federation as laid down in these articles of Federation shall be:


- A) To further interplanetary peace and security;
- B) To promote the political, economic, social, and educational advancement of the inhabitants of the trust regions, and their progressive development towards self-government or independence as may be appropriate to the particular circumstances of each region and its intelligent life-forms concerned, and as may be provided by the terms of the trusteeship agreement;
- C) To encourage respect for intelligent life-form rights and for fundamental freedoms for all without distinction as to culture, sex, language, or religion, and to encourage recognition of the inter-dependence of the intelligent life forms of the galaxy;
- D) To ensure equal treatment in social, economic, and commercial matters for all members of the United Federation and their nationals, and also equal treatment for the latter in the administration of justice, without prejudice to the adjustment of the foregoing objections and subjest to the provisions of Article 80;

Article 77


- The trusteeship system shall apply to such regions in the following categories as may be placed thereunder by means of trusteeship agreements;
 - A) Regions now held under mandate;
- B) Regions which may be detached from alien social systems as a result of interplanetary war; and
- C) Regions voluntarily placed under the trusteeship system by social systems responsible for their administration;













