Cassini Images Bizarre Hexagon on Saturn

Pasadena, Calif. -- An odd, six-sided, honeycomb-shaped feature circling the entire north pole of Saturn has captured the interest of scientists with NASA's Cassini mission.

NASA's Voyager 1 and 2 spacecraft imaged the feature over two decades ago. The fact that it has appeared in Cassini images indicates that it is a long-lived


feature. A second hexagon, significantly darker than the brighter historical feature, is also visible in the Cassini pictures. The spacecraft's visual and infrared mapping spectrometer is the first

instrument to capture the entire hexagon feature in one image.

"This is a very strange feature, lying in a precise geometric fashion with six nearly equally straight sides," said Kevin Baines, atmospheric expert and member of Cassini's visual and infrared mapping spectrometer team at NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory, Pasadena, Calif. "We've never seen."

anything like this on any other planet. Indeed, Saturn's thick atmosphere where circularly-shaped waves and convective cells dominate is perhaps the last place you'd expect to see such a six-sided geometric figure, yet there it is."

The hexagon is similar to Earth's polar vortex, which has winds blowing in a circular pattern




around the polar region. On Saturn, the vortex has a hexagonal rather than circular shape. The hexagon is nearly 25,000 kilometers (15,000 miles) across. Nearly four Earths could fit inside it.

The new images taken in thermal-infrared light show the hexagon extends much deeper down into the atmosphere than previously expected, some 100 kilometers (60 miles) below the cloud tops. A system of clouds lies within the hexagon. The clouds appear to be whipping around the hexagon like cars on a racetrack.

"It's amazing to see such striking differences on opposite ends of Saturn's poles," said Bob Brown, team leader of the Cassini visual and infrared mapping spectrometer, University of Arizona, Tucson. "At the south pole we have what appears to be a hurricane with a giant eye, and at the north pole of Saturn we have this geometric feature, which is

completely different."



The Saturn north pole hexagon has not been visible to Cassini's visual cameras, because it's winter in that area, so the hexagon is under the cover of the long polar night, which lasts about 15 years. The infrared mapping

spectrometer can image Saturn in both daytime and nighttime conditions and see deep inside. It imaged the feature with thermal wavelengths near 5 microns (seven times the wavelength visible to the human eye) during a 12-day period beginning on Oct. 30, 2006. As winter wanes over the next two years, the feature may become visible to the visual cameras.


Based on the new images and more information on the depth of the feature, scientists think it is not linked to Saturn's radio emissions or to auroral activity, as once contemplated, even though Saturn's northern aurora lies nearly overhead.

The hexagon appears to have remained fixed with Saturn's rotation rate and axis since first glimpsed by Voyager 26 years ago. The actual rotation rate of Saturn is still uncertain.

"Once we understand its dynamical nature, this long-lived, deep-seated polar hexagon may give us a clue to the true rotation rate of the deep atmosphere and perhaps the interior," added Baines.

Jet Propulsion Laboratory, a division of the California Institute of Technology in Pasadena, manages the Cassini-Huygens mission for NASA's Science Mission Directorate, Washington. The Cassini orbiter was designed, developed and assembled at JPL. The Visual and Infrared Mapping Spectrometer team is based at the University of Arizona.

Final Trek: Scotty goes to space at last

LAS CRUCES, N.M. (AP) -- The ashes of James Doohan, who played chief engineer Montgomery "Scotty" Scott on the original "Star Trek" TV series, have been loaded into a rocket that is set to launch in

New Mexico later this month.

The remains of Doohan, Mercury astronaut Gordon Cooper and some 200 others were loaded into the rocket Friday by Charles Chafer, chief executive of Celestis, a Texas company that contracts with rocket firms to send cremated remains into space.

"And we're ready to go," Chafer said after inserting the silver canister.

Jerry Larson, president of Connecticut-based UP Aerospace Inc., said the rocket will be launched April 28. Families paid \$495 to have a few grams of their loved one's ashes placed on the rocket.

Chafer said he's aware of the dedication of "Star Trek" fans.

"There's no doubt that we'll find a way to accommodate fans who travel here and want to be part of that experience." he said.

Doohan died in July 2005 at age 85.

The remains of "Star Trek" creator Gene Roddenberry were blasted into space in 1997.



Stress: How to Cope Better With Life's Challenges

What causes stress?

Feelings of stress are caused by the body's instinct to defend itself. This instinct is good in emergencies, such as getting out of the way of a speeding car. But stress can cause physical symptoms if it goes on for too long,

such as in response to life's daily challenges and changes.

When this happens, it's as though your body gets ready to jump out of the way of the car, but you're sitting still. Your body is working overtime, with no place to put all the extra energy. This can make you feel anxious, afraid, worried and uptight.

What changes may be stressful?

Any sort of change can make you feel stressed, even good change. It's not just the change or event itself, but also how you react to it that matters. What's stressful is different for each person. For example, one person may feel stressed by retiring from work, while someone else may not.

Other things that may be stressful include being laid off from your job, your child leaving or returning home, the death of your spouse, divorce or marriage, an illness, an injury, a job promotion, money problems, moving, or having a baby.

Can stress hurt my health?

Stress can cause health problems or make problems worse if you don't learn ways to deal with it. Talk to your family doctor if you think some of your symptoms are caused by stress. It's important to make sure that your symptoms aren't caused by other health problems.

Possible signs of stress

- * Anxiety
- * Back pain
- * Constipation or diarrhea
- * Depression
- * Fatigue
- * Headaches
- * High blood pressure
- * Insomnia
- * Problems with relationships
- * Shortness of breath
- * Stiff neck
- * Upset stomach
- * Weight gain or loss

What can I do to manage my stress?

The first step is to learn to recognize when you're feeling stressed. Early warning signs of stress include tension in your shoulders and neck, or clenching your hands into fists.

The next step is to choose a way to deal with your stress. One way is to avoid the event or thing that leads to your stress--but often this is not possible. A second way is to change how you react to stress. This is often the best way.

Tips for dealing with stress

- * Don't worry about things you can't control, such as the weather.
 - * Prepare to the best of your ability for events you know may be stressful, such as a job interview.
 - * Try to look at change as a positive challenge, not as a threat.
 - * Work to resolve conflicts with other people.
 - * Talk with a trusted friend, family member or counselor.
 - * Set realistic goals at home and at work.
 - * Exercise on a regular basis.
 - * Eat well-balanced meals and get enough sleep.
 - * Meditate.
 - * Participate in something you don't find stressful, such as sports, social events or hobbies.

Why is exercise useful?

Exercise is a good way to deal with stress because it's a healthy way to relieve your pent-up energy and tension. It also helps you get in better shape, which makes you feel better overall.

What is meditation?

Meditation is a form of guided thought. It can take many forms. You may do it with exercise that uses the same motions over and over, like walking or swimming. You may meditate by practicing relaxation training, by stretching or by breathing deeply.

Relaxation training is easy. Start with one muscle. Hold it tight for a few seconds then relax the muscle. Do this with each of your muscles.

Stretching can also help relieve tension. Roll your head in a gentle circle. Reach toward the ceiling and bend side to side slowly. Roll your shoulders.

Deep, relaxed breathing (see the box to the right) by itself may help relieve stress. This helps you get plenty of oxygen.

- * Hold your breath for a second.
- * Breathe out slowly and let your stomach go back down.










place in the distant future. Also appearing is a show called 'Hyperdrive' which Chris has watched on T.V. viewing night with Heroes and 24.



CHAPTER XV THEN SU-PREME-SECRE-TARIAT

ARTICLE 97

THE SE-CRETARIAT

SHALL BE COMPRISED OF A SUPREME-SECRETARIAT AND

2. EACH MEMBER OF THE UNITED FEDERATION UNDERTAKES TO RESPECT THE EXCLUSIVELY INTERPLANETARY CHARACTER OF THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE SUPREME-SECRETARIAT AND THAT THE STAFF SHALL NOT SEEK TO INFLUENCE THEM IN THE DISCHARGE OF THEIR RESPONSIBILITIES.

ARTICLE 101

- 1. THE STAFF SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE SUPREME-SECRETARIAT UNDER REGULATIONS ESTABLISHED BY THE SUPREME ASSEMBLY.

Is Two-Face In The Dark Knight?

Batman Begins writer David Goyer told SCI FI Wire that Harvey Dent will appear in the sequel *The Dark Knight*—but not necessarily his villainous alter ego, Two-Face, as has been reported. "I think Harvey Dent has been mentioned," Goyer said in an interview while promoting his upcoming film *The Invisible*. "I don't know that Two-Face has been mentioned."

Though plot details are top-secret, *The Dark Knight* will reportedly feature the Joker (Heath Ledger) and Dent (Aaron Eckhart) as the nemeses of Batman (Christian Bale). "All I can say is some people raised their eyebrows when they heard there were going to be two villains in the first film [*Batman Begins*], but I think that one worked out just fine," he said.

Goyer added that he and Nolan "spent a long time, a number of weeks, talking before we decided that we could come up with a story that was as exciting, if not more so, than the first one, because we really did not want to let down the fans. We had to figure out a way to top ourselves, and I think we have."

Goyer will receive a "story by" credit on *The Dark Knight*, which he said was a direct result of his commitment to *The Invisible*. "I wrote what you'd call a 'scriptment' with Chris over an accelerated monthlong period, and then we handed it off to his brother, who did the first pass," Goyer said, referring to Jonathan Nolan, who also penned the Christopher Nolan-directed film *The Prestige*. "Jonathan is a very gifted screenwriter in his own right." *The Dark Knight* opens on July 18, 2008. —**Ian Spelling**

Goyer Sells Green Arrow Pitch

Batman Begins writer David Goyer told Wizard magazine that he's sold Warner Brothers on a new take on the Green Arrow, a classic DC Comics superhero.

"Supermax" is Goyer's take on supervillain incarceration in the DC universe, the magazine reported. Goyer's story revolves around a wrongly convicted Green Arrow, who is whisked away to the supermax prison for out-of-control heroes and villains, where he's forced to face a number of inmates that he put there.

"He's Green Arrow for the first 10 minutes of the movie, and then he's arrested, and his secret identity is revealed," Goyer told the magazine. "They shave his goatee, and they take his costume and send him to prison for life, and he has to escape. It's like Alcatraz, and he has to team up with, in some cases, some of the very same villains he is responsible for incarcerating in order to get out and clear his name. Of course, tons of people try to kill him while he's in there. We've populated the prison with all sorts of B and C villains from the DC universe. For the fans, there will be all sorts of characters the hardcore comic-book junkies will know, but they're all going to be there under their human names, and no one is wearing a costume, but there will be a lot of characters with powers and things like that."

Alien Suit Nabs \$126.5K

A creature suit designed by H.R. Giger for Ridley Scott's *Alien* garnered the highest bid—\$126,500—and Christopher Reeve's costume from *Superman: The Movie* came in a close second at \$115,000 in an auction of movie memorabilia in Calabasas Hills, Calif., on April 5, the auction house Profiles in History announced.

All told, the auction of movie and TV costumes and memorabilia took in more than \$2 million. Other top-selling items included a "Winkie" guard costume from *The Wizard of Oz* (\$115,000), Val Kilmer's Batman costume from *Batman Forever* (\$63,250), the golden headpiece of the Staff of Ra from *Raiders of the Lost Ark* (\$69,000) and Leonard Nimoy's Spock tunic from the first season of *Star Trek* (\$34,500).

Potter VII Rules Are Strict

The U.S. publisher of the new Harry Potter novel has strict rules for libraries handling the book this summer, including limiting the number of employees who handle the book before its July 21 release date, the Associated Press reported.

Libraries must also provide names and contact information for each branch manager, according to the contract from Scholastic Inc.

Harry Potter and the Deathly Hallows is the final book in J.K. Rowling's popular series about the boy wizard.

The contract says failure to keep *Deathly Hallows* under wraps until July 21 could get libraries scratched from future embargoed titles.

Lucas OK With Indy 4's Ford

Indiana Jones 4 producer George Lucas told <u>USA Today</u> that he doesn't have a problem with 64-year-old Harrison Ford reprising the role of the action hero.

"He's not running in any of the movies," Lucas told the newspaper.

"He's either on a horse or driving a car or a motorcycle. And he'll play his age in this movie with what's appropriate. The chases are more suspenseful than speedy. Like the rolling ball in the first film: It's not that he's running that fast, it's that there's a giant ball coming at him. And he will get beat up, which is a tradition for us."

Lucas, who also is in preproduction on a "bare-bones, action-heavy" *Star Wars* live-action TV series, said there'll still be plenty of action in *Indy 4*, the official title of which he hopes to keep under wraps until the first trailer hits theaters around Thanksgiving.

Sean Connery has yet to sign on as Indiana's father, Dr. Henry Jones, but Lucas said: "We're still trying."

And it wasn't his idea to cast Cate Blanchett as Ford's new leading

lady. "That's who my director wanted, and I always bow to the wishes of my director," Lucas said of Steven Spielberg. "I approved it, because she seemed like a good idea. When I met her at the Academy Awards, I told her, 'Hey, you work for me now!"

Rhythm & Hues Doing Hulk F/X

Rhythm & Hues Studios has been named the lead visual-effects house on *The Incredible Hulk* from Marvel Studios, which is scheduled to start production in June in Toronto, according to *The Hollywood Reporter*.

Louis Leterrier will direct from a script by Stan Lee, Jack Kirby and Zak Penn. Lee also will serve as an executive producer.

The new film will give the Hulk a new look, as the Ang Lee-directed 2003 *Hulk* featured a computer-generated character and visual effects from Industrial Light & Magic.

Rhythm & Hues was selected after several months of research and development that included the creation of a new CG Hulk.

The company is well known for its character animation. For *The Chronicles of Narnia: The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe*, the studio's work included the film's well-received CG lion Aslan. Earlier character work included *Babe*, which won an Academy Award for achievement in visual effects.

Maguire Open To Spidey 4

Tobey Maguire, who reprises the role of Peter Parker in the upcoming *Spider-Man 3*, told SCI FI Wire in February that he remained open to a fourth film, with reservations. This despite earlier reports that the third webslinger movie would be his last. Maguire is not contractually bound to do a fourth film.

"Well, it's possible that we make another movie," Maguire said in an interview. "It all depends on if there's a story worth telling. I feel very proud of the three movies that we've made. I feel like the stories all deserve to be told, and, you know, if they come up with a good movie, and the whole team wants to get back together, and we feel like we can make a good movie that's worth making, then I'm up for it."

His co-star, Kirsten Dunst (Mary Jane Watson), echoed the sentiment in a separate interview in February. And for her, it depended on whether or not writer/director Sam Raimi agreed to a fourth installment. "There's an openness at the end [of Spider-Man 3], which I like, but ... I feel like this is a trilogy unto itself," she said. "And I think if we venture into a fourth, it will be some time from now and in a new way. Because I don't think Sam can do that: continuing on this same course. I think he needs to venture as an artist and do other things; otherwise, none of us will have anything good to bring to the fourth. So I think we all need to venture out a little bit, and then maybe we'll come back together one day and do another one."

She added: "I would work with Sam on any movie he wanted to work on it with me, because I just adore that man."

For his part, Raimi hasn't said one way or another whether he'd do another movie. Producer Avi Arad has been quoted as saying he'd move ahead with a fourth *Spider-Man* with or without Maguire. *Spider-Man 3* opens May 4.

Johnny "Vette" Verhoek of Kassabian Motors has had the car, the "Knight Industries Two Thousand," on display for about a

month.

This K.I.T.T. is one of four documented picture cars used for closeup shots and scenes where David Hasselhoff, who played Michael Knight in the series, was behind the wheel.

Key features of the car are intact, including the red scanner light on the nose that glows and makes a humming noise. Alas, it doesn't really talk.

Sarandon, Goodman Mull Speed

Susan Sarandon and John Goodman are in negotiations to play the parents of Emile Hirsch's title character in *Speed Racer*, the live-action version of the anime TV series being directed by Larry and Andy Wachowski, according to *The Hollywood Reporter*.

Based on the classic 1960s series that was created by anime pioneer Tatsuo Yoshida and retooled for North American audiences, *Speed* follows the adventures of young race-car driver, Speed (Hirsch), and his quest for glory in his thundering, gadget-laden vehicle Mach 5.

The show revolved around Speed's family, and the Wachowskis are being selective about whom they pick for those roles. Goodman is playing Pops, a race-car owner and builder. Sarandon's character is the backbone of the family, as well as the Mach 5 Go Racing Team, the trade paper reported.

Casting is under way for the characters of Speed's girlfriend, Trixie, and his mysterious archrival, Racer X.

The plan is for the Wachowskis, who are writing and directing, to shoot in Germany in the summer for a summer 2008 release.



Boston Marathon

OSTON (AP) - Zooming through low-Earth orbit at 17,500 mph, Suni Williams completes the standard marathon distance every 5.4 seconds.

Good thing Rosie Ruiz never thought of that.

Williams is registered for next month's Boston Marathon, even though she'll be stuck on the international space station when the rest of the field lines up for the 111th edition of the race. So the U.S. Navy commander will run the equivalent distance on a treadmill - 210 miles above Earth, and tethered to her track by bungee cords so she doesn't float away.

Not since Ruiz hopped the 'T' to the finish line to accept the winner's wreath in 1980 has a Boston Marathon competitor relied so heavily on public transportation.

"She thought it would be cool if she gave it a try," said Williams' sister, Dina Pandya, who will run the race the traditional way. "She said, I'll call you on Heartbreak Hill."

Another NASA astronaut, Karen Nyberg, will dodge the potholes from Hopkinton to Boston's Back Bay on April 16 along with Pandya and almost 24,000 other runners. Although the race starts at 10 a.m. EDT on Earth, Williams might not be able to run contemporaneously because her sleep schedule - a fairly arbitrary matter in space - is set for the arrival of a Soyuz mission.

"I'm not sure the timing will be that she'll be awake," Pandya said. "They're going to be on Russian time, so they're kind of sleep-shifting."

Williams qualified for the Boston race by finishing last January's Houston Marathon in 3 hours, 29 minutes, 57 seconds. Pandya didn't sweat the logistics when she signed them both up, but on Dec. 9 Williams took off on the space shuttle Discovery and it became clear she wasn't going to make it to the starting line. "I considered it a huge honor to qualify, and I didn't want my qualification to expire without giving it a shot," Williams told the Boston Athletic Association, which organizes the oldest of the world's annual marathons.

The BAA offered to send an official entrant's bib and a special finisher's medal - made without lead, per NASA orders - to the space station. But when this month's launch of the shuttle Atlantis was postponed, Williams had to be emailed a bib that she can print out; the other souvenirs will have to wait.

Race organizers have cooperated with far-flung endeavors like the "Boston Marathon in Iraq," sending extensive packages of trophies, water bottles and even a finish line tape to the Middle East for three years running. A similar shipment is headed for Kosovo this year.

But this is the first satellite race they've ever had on a satellite.

"The Boston Marathon is the pinnacle achievement for most runners," BAA spokesman Jack Fleming said. "For Suni to choose to run the 26.2 miles in space on Patriots Day is really a tribute to the thousands of marathoners who are running here on Earth. She is pioneering a new frontier in running and in sports with her run, which will truly be out of this world."


Williams, 41, has run a handful of marathons, and she went through rigorous testing before being blasted into orbit. But three months with little gravity takes a toll on a human, and NASA requires all members of a station crew to exercise on the treadmill, a stationary bike and a resistance machine to maintain bone density and muscle mass.


