


The Max's Decomission pt. 1





I wonder what kind of ship we will be getting. I can imagine Squirrelly is just as excited.





The following was taken from Reuters, via Yahoo! Health. While I am not particularly a fan of the World Health Organization, I thought this was an interesting companion piece to the article I submitted last month.

WHO says world moving closer to Phase 6 flu

GENEVA (Reuters) - The spread of H1N1 flu in Australia, Britain, Chile, Japan and Spain has moved the world closer to the top pandemic alert, the World Health Organization said on Tuesday. "We are at Phase 5 but are getting closer to Phase 6," Keiji Fukuda, acting WHO assistant directorgeneral, told journalists during a telephone conference.

"There are a number of countries that appear to

be in transition, moving from travel-related cases to more established community types of spread," he said.

"Some of these countries are the countries that you have been following for quite a while, but they include countries such as the UK and Spain in Europe, Japan in Asia, Chile in South America and also Australia." According to the WHO's latest figures, the new influenza strain, also known as swine flu, has been found in 64 countries, and remains most prevalent in North America. WHO laboratories have confirmed nearly 19,000 infections including 117 people who have died.

Fukuda said those figures might not show the full reach of the contagious disease that has afflicted young people more than normal seasonal flu, and has caused mainly mild symptoms as it has spread around the world. "We don't know the full number of people who are infected across the entire spectrum," Fukuda said. "We do have some hesitation in calling such an infection mild. The future impact of this infection has yet to unfold."

The WHO is working on revamping its six-point pandemic scale so that the top alert reflects the severity of the flu and not just the geographical pattern of its spread. Fukuda said one idea was to add a three-point severity scale within the highest marker, so that the overall level could reach 6 even if the flu's symptoms remained moderate, and it could be adjusted later if it had more serious effects.



All the cast members fit into the roles. Karl Urban does great as McCoy-even saying the classic line 'Are you out of your Vulcan mind?' Simon Pegg appears later as Scotty, but he still works the miracles. Only this time he seems to have a sidekick with him at times. Anton Yelchin does great as Chekov. John Cho plays Sulu very well right down to the sword fighting on the drill. And Zoe Saldena looks beautiful as Nyota Uhura. Yes her first name is canon at last!


There's some humor as well. Some involving McCoy getting Kirk on the Enterprise and jabbing him with so many drugs having different effects to where it seems like Kirk is a pincushion. And Kirk in Uhura's quarters proving the fan myth that he does have sex with the 'green chicks'. And some banter between Kirk and Spock as well in the final confrontation with Nero. Especially as they discuss Nero's surrender as he falls into a black hole. A surrender Nero refuses.

Some of it may fall into the category of unbelievable, but this is a very enjoyable film. And it captures Star Trek well. At least I believe so. I saw no efforts to devalue what came before, but rather to work with what came before as Abrams went his own way. And instead of a cold restart he did a mid gear switch-which I believed worked.

Sometimes when you change things, one must look at how to bring that change about. What to change, and what the change is for? For the good of the property and its fans or for the good of one's ego and career? In my eyes Abrams seemed to have chosen the good of the property and the good of the fans. And he pulled off that choice well.

I hear Chris has seen the film 8 times. Perhaps more after this. No way will I be able to break his record. But still it is a great film. Trek has changed and it is change I can live with.
